5. Principal's Report

- Student population 375.
- District welcoming 350 students of parents coming to Canada on work visas, refugees, etc, Clinton asked to reorganize classes to accommodate 17 of these students.
- Upcoming: Sep 28-29 Parents as Partners, book 10 min session online, early dismissal for Gr. 1-7.

Sep 30 National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, school closed.

Oct 3 Pro-D Day, no classes.

Oct 5-7 Camp Elphinsote, Gr. 7 overnight field trip.

Oct 7 Terry Fox Run.

Oct 8 Thanksgiving, school closed

Oct 11 Artstarts drumming group performance.

- Safety protocols Students to wash hands, personal choice to wear masks, students to provide their own masks, office no longer providing masks to students, if student feels ill they will be sent home.
- Entrances/Exits Will be same as last year. Primary grades use their own exterior doors (Portland Ave). Gr. 3-4 use main entrance (Buller Ave). Intermediate grades use secondary entrance (Clinton Ave).
- Recess One recess 10:30am-10:45am, students can bring recess food outside.
- Lunch One lunch, 12:10pm-14:48pm, all students at go outside at 12:20pm. Primary classes will have Intermediate lunch monitors. Student can not bring lunch food outside. Focus is on zero waste.

6. Parents questions and/or comments for the Principal

- Q) Are there any after school sports? A) All after school sports depend on teachers/staff to organize. After school sports are for Intermediates (Gr. 4-7). Fall will be Cross County, Basketball, Volleyball. Spring will be Track & Field.
- Q) Will there be after school soccer? A) No, lots of students already are on club teams.
- Q) Can parents organize after school soccer? A) No, after school sports need to be organized by teachers/staff.
- Q) Will there be any after school sports/activities for Primary (K-Gr. 3)? A) School working with City of Burnaby Parks & Rec to bring after school activities back for Fall. Possibly Gr. 4-7 Babysitting and Leadership, K-Gr. 3 Science, Multisports, Lego. Intermediates already doing in school leadership activities including morning announcements, laptop maintenance, garbage pick up, Primary lunch monitors.
- Q) Will there be any District programs in place for families coming to Canada on work visas, refugees, etc? A)
 District has team in place to welcome these families. Clinton families interested in helping are encouraged to email Mr. Bortolussi.
- Q) Is the SWIS (Settlement Workers in Schools) Program still in place? A) Yes. It is separate from the refugees
 program. District also offers language program support.

- Q) What is in place for learning support? A) Focus is on in class vs pull out support. Clinton has 3 new support teachers this year.
- Q) Parent's children do not like specific teacher's teaching methods. What can parents do? A) Mr. Bortolussi's door is always open and parents welcome to speak to him directly.
- Q) Some parents more likely to donate cash to fundraisers like the Terry Fox Run. Why can't parents send cash donations to school? A) District no longer wants cash in schools due to incident 10+ years ago where large amount of money went missing. District now wants schools to be cashless, still willing to accept person cheque from parents.

7. Chair's Report

- Munch A Lunch Fall (Term 1) is open! Added Mon as a trail fro Term 1. Some parents have asked for lunch program to run 5 day a week, PAC is limited to number of volunteers available. Mon require 1 parent volunteer + 2 Gr. 7 student volunteers. Fri require 2-3 parent volunteers. Volunteers needed starting at 11:30am to sort meals, deliver bins to and collect bins from classrooms, sort garbage/compost/recycling.
- Spirit Wear Fundraiser Is open!
- Welcome Back Potluck Scheduled for Sep 23 5-7pm. Free community event. Last one was done Sep 2019. Will be in the gym if raining or in courtyard if not. Bring nut free dish for 10-12 people from home or bring your own family's picnic meal. Will need volunteers to set up, monitor and clean up. No games.
- Family Movie Night Tentatively scheduled for Oct 20. Free community event. Possibly offer pre-order sushi and pizza via Much-A-Lunch site or bring your own family's picnic meal, have cash sales of popcorn and candy, Halloween themed movie.
- 3 Projects:
 - Library 4 new tables coming mid Oct. Working with District on affordable stool option. Restricted by District, can not do anything to anything attached to walls. School has submitted work order to replace bookshelves. Plans in progress to organizing art project that includes all grades, will be looking for ideas, volunteers that are artists and carpenters for projects, volunteers to weed out old books and integrate new books. Scholastic Book Fair scheduled for Sep 26-29.
 - Garden 1 of 3 benches installed, 1 of 4 picnic tables installed.
 - Earthquake Bin Earthquake drill done in Jun. PAC bought supplies with funds from Non-Fundraising Fundraiser. Still need to buy 3rd pop up tent canopy, hand operated water pumps.

- Have healthy balance in accounts, will be distributing funds throughout year. Looking into poinsettia sale (Dec),
 Mother's Day flower/plant sale (May), Father's Day flower/plant sale (Jun).
- Q) Gr.7 Grad gets only \$250? A) PAC gives Gr.7 Grad Committee \$250 plus money raised from Lees' Bottle Depot and Cobs Bread from Jan-Jun, the committee also does their own fundraising.
