5. Principal Report

- Student population 365.
- Approximate class sizes: G.1 16, Gr.2-3 18, Gr.4-5 25-26, Gr.6-7 28-29.
- School has room for 50 additional students. Expecting additional students from 450 work visa families coming to Burnaby, new residential complex at Buller Ave/Irmin St. Clinton in 1950's had 300 students, late 1980's had 500 students + 3 portables.
- Results from survey done last year indicate District is struggling for school space.
- Demographic of poverty level is high at Clinton, 10% of student population need support.
- Clinton runs modified lunch program, Mr. Bortolussi applied to District for additional funding, PAC buys 5-10 extra lunches per week that are served immediately or frozen and served later, Cobs Bread donated 8-10 loaves of bread that are distributed immediately or frozen and distributed later.
- Volleyball runs Oct-Nov for Gr.6-7 students, play home and away games, season ends with District event at TBD high school.
- Gr.6 immunization is Wed Oct 18, will be offering again in spring.
- PAC Potluck is Fri Oct 13 in the Courtyard.
- PAC organizing several community events, please consider volunteering!

6. Parent guestions and/or comments for the Principal

- Q1) What team sports are offered? A1) Cross Country Gr.4-7 Oct, Volleyball Gr.6-7 Oct-Nov, Basketball Gr.6-7 Jan-Feb, Track & Field Gr.4-7 spring. Teachers volunteer to organize and run team sports.
- Q2) The hole in the fence along West property line is bigger. When will it get repaired? A2) Mr. Bortolussi submitted repair
 request to District, small holes fixed, will follow up with District about big hole.
- Q3) Can parents or businesses donate food to school to support families? A3) Yes! Parents and businesses can email Mr. Bortolussi (claudio.bortolussi@burnabyschools.ca) to make arrangements.
- Q4) Why are there so many split grade classes this year? A4) School works within guidelines set by Province and District.
 Class composition includes (but is not limited to): special needs, ELL, French, IEP, class number limits, contractional obligations. They also try to account for friendships, boy/girl ratios, etc.


