# 2023-24 DPAC Report MEETING SUMMARY

Monday, November 20, 2023

#### **Burnaby School District**

• Emotional Regulation – Supporting your child with open conversations- Presentation by Roberto Bombelli, Deputy Superintendent, and Nick Christofides, Director of Instruction.

They will send the package to us. It was mostly a discussion about how parents can help their children to navigate emotions.

#### **DPAC Update**

- The issues in the DPAC executive are still unresolved. Laura Ward, vice-chair (and BCC PAC chair), stated that they will sort out the conflict by January, and she will resign at the end of that month. If that doesn't happen, the whole executive needs to resign to re-elect the new exec members.
- The DPAC reps agree on the need to have access, review, and eventually approve or amend the May, September, October, and November meetings on the January meeting. The district needs to send the slides of the past presentations (September, October). The reps request more transparency from the DPAC executive, an update on the DPAC exec Committees, and documented updates on the conversations with the district.
- There is a motion seconded to elect two members for Central West to join the executive. The positions were fulfilled.
- Some schools are running out of capacity. Maywood rep asks DPAC exec to bring this issue to the district.
   Another parent explained that they started a committee at their school and a petition. Same for Brentwood, Alpha.
   Laura W. will ask the district about it, and BCC PAC is trying to bring this to the Ministry of Education. A rep proposes to set up an Advocacy Group for Burnaby (as there is one in Vancouver). Laura states that she will answer this on the next meeting.
- It is noticeable that the trustees have not been present in the last DPAC meetings. Laura W. explains it has to do with conflicting schedules.
- The 2011 DPAC Bylaws might need to change as they are outdated.

- Marlborough: Jazz concert with a special guest, Corey Reeds ('low-cost celebrity') and silent auction on December 22nd.
- Clinton: FundScrip fundraiser (gift cards), family movie night Nov. 23rd plus Grad pizza fundraiser. Pancake breakfast on December 21st.
